Dorothy Suratt Clinehens, age 99, of Fayetteville passed away Tuesday February 5, 2019. She was born April 2, 1919 in Fort Smith, Arkansas to Hugh and Ethel Suratt Gunter. She is a member of First United Presbyterian Church in Fayetteville. She was preceded in death by her husband Charles Clinehens Sr. and her daughter, Marietta Hulse. As a graduate of Texas Women's College with a degree in library science, she moved to Fayetteville to become the librarian for the Washington County Library, the first librarian in the state to have a degree in library science. She had a deep love of beauty which could be seen in her garden, artwork, fiber arts, and expansive collection of seashells, as well as her books, which were always close by. She was a progressive and independent thinker, and she fiercely loved her husband, children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces, and nephews. Her home was always open and a center of all family activity.
